What is a bequest?

A bequest is the most common type of planned gift. It is a gift, left in your Will, and designated as you see fit. Bequests can take several forms; they can be a specific amount, a particular asset (e.g. a property or investment) or a percentage portion of your estate. Bequests made to charitable organizations may help minimize taxes to your estate.

How to include a bequest in your Will

Begin by speaking with your Lawyer about your intentions. We have provided some sample bequest wording below that can be used in your Will.

For a specific amount:

“I give \$_____ to support the work of the Glenrose Rehabilitation Hospital Foundation, charitable registration number 89101 6347 RR0001”.

For estate (either portion or whole):

“I bequeath the residue of my Estate (or ____ %) to the Glenrose Rehabilitation Hospital Foundation, charitable registration number 89101 6347 RR0001”.
